

Test Correction Policy

You have one week to complete test corrections. The week begins on the day that your graded test is returned to you.

You may get help from someone else (including the teacher), but please make sure you understand each of your errors and can explain them verbally, as well as in writing.

You must do the following on a separate piece of paper for each incorrect question or problem:

- Number the problem/question and rewrite it.
- Write at least two complete sentences, including:
 - Your inspection of the error (type of error, your plan for correction)
 - Proof of new understanding
- Show all work to correct the problem or question and include your new solution.
- Remember: correcting your test means you can earn as much as half of your missed points back!

Types of Errors

CARELESS

Careless errors happen when we are not paying close attention or when we are working too quickly.

CONCEPTUAL

Conceptual errors happen when we do not understand the underlying mathematical concepts or when we have used incorrect logic and reasoning.
